NOTICE OF ENFORCEMENT

City code states that it is the responsibility of the property owner to keep the trees on, or overhanging the streets, trimmed so that all branches will be at least 15 ft above the surface of the street. This also includes trees that are planted close to the street and overhang the curb area (example: evergreen trees). This ordinance will be enforced this year, so please have your trees trimmed to avoid notices and possible assessment of fees to conform.
