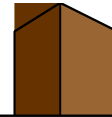

PUBLIC NOTICE



In an effort to ensure the safety of our children the Lake Park Police Dept would like to remind you that the City of Lake Park does have a curfew for minors. Those between the ages of 16 and 18 should not remain upon any alleys, streets, public places, or places of business between 12:00 (midnight) and 5:00am. For those under 16 the time frame is 11:00pm to 5:00am. The restriction does not apply to any minor who is traveling between home and a place of employment or school and church activities.



MOWING REMINDERS

With summer comes lawn care. The city would like to remind you of 2 ordinances that may be enforced at any time:

- 1—Lawns are not allowed to exceed a height of 10 inches.
- 2—Debris, including grass, is not allowed to be thrown in the street. This debris ends up in the storm sewer system thus causing blockage and flooding. Keep this in mind when you mow.

The enforcement of these ordinances can include fines to the resident.
