

SUMMER REMINDERS



With spring comes yard clean up. Be sure to note if there is any “junk” or vehicles that are inoperable that need to be removed. The City has an ordinance that prohibits junk/junk vehicles from accumulating in any yard. This **will be enforced** this summer.

By ordinance the grass height is to be less than 10 inches on the 1st & 15th of the month from May thru October. You will only receive 1 warning per summer. The second time will result in mowing by the City at \$100 per hour, minimum 1 hour.

As you mow, remember you are **not to throw grass, leaves, or any yard waste into the street as this can lead to the blockage of storm drains.**

RECYCLING/GARBAGE

By now, you have likely received your new container for recycling from Waste Management. If you have not please contact the City 712-832-3527 so we can be sure a container is delivered to you. The new containers will be a convenient way to gather your recyclables. Increases in the recycling & garbage rates have caused the city to also increase the rates to our residents. Beginning July 1, the new rates will be as follows:

Residential:

\$17.00 48Gal&Recycle Cart
\$23.00 65Gal&Recycle Cart

Commercial no dumpster:

\$19.00 48Gal&Recycle Cart
\$25.00 65Gal&Recycle Cart

Commercial w/dumpster:

Own dumpster \$10.00 plus \$8 yard
Rent dumpster \$15.75/26.00 plus \$8 yard

With both the recycling and garbage we are billed by address whether they pick up or not. You will be billed for this whether you use it or not. Keep in mind that recycling keeps excess waste from going to the land fill which helps keep garbage rates down.

There is a cardboard dumpster located at the city shed if you have excess cardboard to dispose of.
